This was done to allow Guildford Cricket Club, the organisers of the Guildford Beer Festival, to use Wi-Fi for their payment terminals . In previous years, 4G had been used, but a quicker and more robust solution was now required.

## **PLANNING**

This was a new type of project for us and as such, involved many hours of Googling, YouTube videos and research into various solutions in the hope that it would appear that we knew what we were doing.

Having experience in deploying Wi-Fi solutions by a vendor called Ubiquiti, we discovered their range of radio transmitters and receivers, which are used to create building to building Wi-Fi bridges.

## Completed tasks

- Fixing brackets and 8ft pole to a utilities cabinet
- Mounting the radio transmitter, receiver and Wi-Fi access point

- Creation of a segregated Wi-Fi network
- New cable run from the interior of the building to the scoreboard.
